Worship defined: (Webster)

- Excellence of character; dignity; worth; worthiness.
- → The act of paying divine honors to the Supreme Being; religious reverence and homage; adoration, or acts of reverence, paid to God, or a being viewed as God.

- Worship defined: (Eerdman's Bible Dictionary)
- → To pay homage to, or literally, to ascribe worth to some person or thing. Hence worship embraces the whole of the reverent life, including piety and liturgy.

We are called to worship God according to his terms, not ours

What is Worship?

- Worship always begins with God he is the one who initiates
- Worship, then, is our response to God's ongoing, initiating, and active presence in the lives of his people and the world
- We respond in 2 ways to God's initiation:
 - 1. Worship/obedience/thankfulness/praise
 - 2. Rebellion

Exodus 5:1-5

- 1 Afterward Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh and said, "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'Let my people go, so that they may hold a festival to me in the desert.' " 2 Pharaoh said, "Who is the LORD, that I should obey him and let Israel go? I do not know the LORD and I will not let Israel go."
