- 2. "I Bring you good news of Great joy that will be for all the people."
  - I Bring God is doing, The Almighty is speaking
  - be excited, overjoyed, thrilled full of anticipation
  - The news is good breath the sigh of relief
  - The new is for everyone not just you!
  - Relay this with joy, passion, excitement, tell everyone
  - \*how do you speak about the Christmas season?

- 3. "Today in the city of David a Savior has been born to you!"
  - Savior one who saves, one who rescues those in danger or distress, unable to help themselves
  - The promise handed down for generations here!
- 4. Here is the Proof!
  - details and descriptions
  - begging to be investigated go and see for yourself
  - \* ever challenge people to check out the claims of Jesus?

#### 5. Grand Proclamation!

- -"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests."
- This proclamation has huge implications for mankind
- shalom not the absence of war or conflict. Not the removal of difficult circumstances. It is the concept of wholeness and completeness. Being at rest within whole and complete not needing or wanting anymore!

- To Men on Whom His Favor Rests
  - Suggesting that it will not be universal in scope
  - Suggesting that God plays a part in who experiences
  - Suggesting that relationship plays a part
- \* we often do not emphasize this truth in our presentation of God's gift at Christmas. It is available to all, not experienced by all!
