Several Observations:

- 1. Some take membership for granted
 - it's my church home I don't care if I vote or not
- 2. Some ignore the whole idea
 - why bother see no difference between active attendee's and members. What's the big deal
- 3. Some are actively opposed to signing up
- -"If I come and worship as often as the members...if I fellowship with these believers as much as anyone else, if I profit from the teaching and other ministries of the church, and if I actively demonstrate love for my brothers and sisters in Christ here, why should I formally join the church?" Don Whitney

- 1. Witness to Our World
 - making clear our priorities and aligning ourselves
 - collectively we are a witness
 - gifts working in conjunction to bear witness
- 2. For others In the Family
 - taking the family name become part of the family history
 - serving and being served key in Jesus life

"If the church is a building, then we must be bricks in it; if the church is a body, then we are its members; if the church is the household of faith, it presumes we are part of that household. Sheep are in a flock and branches are on a vine. Biblically, if one is a Christian, he must be a member of a church. Leaving aside the concrete particulars for a moment--whether membership lists are kept on white cards or on computer disks--we must not forsake our regular assembling (Hebrews 10:25). This membership is not simply the record of a statement we once made or of affection toward a familiar place. It must be a reflection of a living commitment or it is worthless, and worse than worthless, it is dangerous. Uninvolved members confuse both real members and non-Christians about what it means to be a Christian. And active members do the voluntarily inactive members no service when they allow them to remain members of the church, for membership is the church's corporate endorsement of a person's salvation."
