

We have to know our letters so we can read the words.

But we need more than bare words to have understanding ...

phrases
sentences
syntax
context

Genre: the type of literature ... in the Bible we have ...

story-telling that is factual and for a purpose – more than simply stringing stories together

Hebrew poetry and Greek poetry and ancient hymns of the church

#### conversations

# letters written to particular people in a particular place

# letters written to specific churches

or letters meant to be read as circular letters passed from church to church

# great prophetic writings like Isaiah or Jeremiah

# prophecy coupled with apocalyptic imagery in Daniel and Ezekiel and Revelation

# parables of Jesus and, of course, direct instruction

# some 40 human authors written over 1600 years

all pointing toward a single person a single purpose one message

# The Bible shows us sinful human beings the way back to God.
