Background


- ▼State of Israel

1 Kings 18 1-16

After many days the word of the LORD came to Elijah, in the third year, saying, "Go, show yourself to Ahab, and I will send rain upon the earth." 2 So Elijah went to show himself to Ahab. Now the famine was severe in Samaria. ³ And Ahab called Obadiah, who was over the household. (Now Obadiah feared the LORD greatly, 4 and when Jezebel cut off the prophets of the LORD, Obadiah took a hundred prophets and hid them by fifties in a cave and fed them with bread and water.)










 7 And as Obadiah was on the way, behold, Elijah met him. And Obadiah recognized him and fell on his face and said, "Is it you, my lord Elijah?" 8 And he answered him, "It is I. Go, tell your lord, 'Behold, Elijah is here.'" 9 And he said, "How have I sinned, that you would give your servant into the hand of Ahab, to kill me? 10 As the LORD your God lives, there is no nation or kingdom where my lord has not sent to seek you.







hid a hundred men of the LORD's prophets by fifties in a cave and fed them with bread and water? 14 And now you say, 'Go, tell your lord, "Behold, Elijah is here"'; and he will kill me." 15 And Elijah said, "As the LORD of hosts lives, before whom I stand, I will surely show myself to him today." 16 So Obadiah went to meet Ahab, and told him. And Ahab went to meet Elijah. 17 When Ahab saw Elijah, Ahab said to him, "Is it you, you troubler of



Israel?" 18 And he answered, "I have not troubled Israel, but you have, and your father's house, because you have abandoned the commandments of the LORD and followed the Baals. 19 Now therefore send and gather all Israel to me at Mount Carmel, and the 450 prophets of Baal and the 400 prophets of Asherah, who eat at Jezebel's table."



- 1. It says Obadiah "feared the Lord Greatly"

 Keep in mind...
 - Obadiah lived in a perverse culture
 - He was trusted and respected by Ahab
 - Obadiah did what was right, not what was easy.
 - This is out of his fear of God



- 2. Obadiah puts God's desire before his fears
 - Obadiah is fully aware of the consequences of going to Ahab
 - Upon the oath of Elijah, He goes
 - Obadiah's fear of God was greater than his fear of man

This shows the tremendous courage of Obadiah



- 3. Ahab is an example of lacking the fear of God
 - Ahab blames Elijah for troubling Israel
 - •We need to be careful not to dismiss the wisdom of others
 - Ahab has been deceived into believing that other gods can save him



Faithful Behind Enemy Lines So What?

Obadiah and Ahab are contrasted

- 1. Humility comes from a healthy revering-fear of God as seen in Obadiah
 - To lose the fear is to be deceived like Ahab



- 2. This fear may pose a risk
 - Culture says to take the path of least resistance.
 - With Obadiah the right thing for him was counter cultural
 - He obeyed God and didn't
 submit to the culture



- 3. Don't push the world away!
 - Ahab sought to get rid of the messenger to get rid of the message
 - We can push people away who are giving us great wisdom and warning



- 3. Don't push the world away!

 - Obadiah never cuts himself off from Ahab
 - Christians can be know for legalism and in turn sever all ties with the world..."We don't associate with them"
