### The Power of Story...

- Stories shape us as they draw us into their narratives
- They speak both to our intellect and our emotions/heart
- They inspire us and encourage us
- Why we prepare for Christmas
  - Reminds us of the one true story
  - Draws us back from the false narratives of our culture to the Gospel

  - Ultimately the Bible is the story of God and his most loved creation people
  - Jesus' birth was much anticipated and was God's "plan A" right from the beginning
    - 300+ prophesies pointing to Jesus

#### John 1:6-16

<sup>6</sup> There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. <sup>7</sup> He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. 8 He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. 9 The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. 10 He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. 11 He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. 12 But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of

#### John 1:6-16

God, <sup>13</sup> who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. 15 (John bore witness about him, and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me.''') 16 For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace

- Who was John?
  - Luke 1... The birth of John
  - Zechariah & Elizabeth
    - → Levite Priest
    - "Righteous and blameless"
    - Childless and "very old"
    - Serving in temple
    - Chosen by lot to enter temple to burn incense

Luke 1:11-17...

11 Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. 12 When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. 13 But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him ohn. 14 He will be a joy and delight to ou, and many will rejoice because of his birth, 15 for he will be great in the sight the Lord.

Luke 1:11-17...

He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even before he is born. 16 He will bring back many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. 17 And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children and the disobedient of the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the

- Who was John?
  - Zechariah has doubts
  - Gabriel, the angel, closes his mouth
  - People all know he has seen a vision but he is unable to speak
  - Elizabeth becomes pregnant
  - Elizabeth meets with Mary
  - John born Zechariah's mouth opened



Luke 3:2b-6...

...the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. <sup>3</sup> He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. <sup>4</sup> As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet:



Luke 3:2b-6...

- "A voice of one calling in the wilderness,
- 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.
- <sup>5</sup> Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low.
- The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth.
  - And all people will see God's salvation.

John 1:29-34...

him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! <sup>30</sup> This is the one I meant when I said, 'A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.' <sup>31</sup> I myself did not know him, but the reason came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel."

John 1:29-34...

32 Then John gave this testimony: "I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him. 33 And I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' 34 I have seen and I testify hat this is God's Chosen One."

  - Broken promises



- 1. The stories of our culture are strong

1 Peter 5:15...

But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect
